

## PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AUG. 5th 1911.

Board met pursuant to adjournment of Aug. 8th, 1911. Roll call showing present Chairman Evan Veitch, W. A. McKay, D. C. Jones, Commissioners, and Dee J. Wren Clerk. Bills were presented and acted upon as follows to wit:-

Board met this 11th day of August A. D. 1911 in Special Session as per call of Chairman Evan Veitch. Those present were Chairman Evan Veitch, and Commissioners D. C. Jones and W. A. McKay and Clerk Dee J. Wren.

Proceedings were had as follows to wit.

Pursuant to numerous petitions

for the construction of bridges and work upon the roads of the County the Board made an extended trip throughout the County, for the purpose of viewing the roads in general. Having returned they report the conditions of the roads in very bad shape in a number of places, and the repairing of such roads will necessitate the expenditure of a large amount of money. Taking into consideration the fact that there were so many bridges which had to be put in and so much road work done, after the floods during the spring of 1909, that the road and bridge fund was exhausted for 1909 and 1910.

Some of the signers of the petitions now on file not knowing the existing conditions, have so far as endeavored to employ counsel to force the Commissioners to repair the roads etc, despite the fact that the ~~if~~ there is not any money in the road and bridge fund.

~~Now therefore be it resolved that inasmuch as the levy which can be placed for the purpose of road and bridge~~

As the limit placed upon the valuation affecting counties of the class

with a valuation of from \$15,000,000.00 to \$16,000,000.00 is 5 and 1/4 mills total tax, it will be impossible to make a levy which will produce enough money in the road and bridge fund to meet the demands for the repairing and building of roads. Likewise under this condition it will be impossible to place a levy that will produce funds enough to pay for the keep of the Poor and Paupers, of the County. For the year of 1910 the cost of keeping the Poor and Pauper being in round numbers \$8,000.00.

Taking into consideration the above facts, it was regularly moved by Commissioner Veitch, and seconded by Commissioner McKay, that Commissioners Jones and McKay take the matter up personally with the State Board ~~of~~ <sup>of</sup> Board of Equalization, and set forth the fact at least two mills additional levy will be necessary to meet the expense for the maintainance of the Roads and Bridges, and one half of one mill for the keep of the Poor and Paupers. for the year of 1911.

Motion was duly put and declared carried.

There being no further business, adjournment was made to Sept. 5th A. D. 1911. to meet in regular session as is by law required.
