

#### PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS JAN. 9TH, A. D. 1913.

Board met pursuant to adjournment of Jan. 8th, Rollcall showing present Commissioners Robert A. Day, Wm. A? McKay Chairman and L. B. Magor Clerk.

County Assesor Chas. B. Boyce presented for the approval of the Board the division of the County into assesment districts as follows:-

District No. 1. All of School Districts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 11, 12, 13, 14, 17, 19, 21, 24, 31, 32, 33, 34, 36, and 37.

District No. 2. All of School Districts Nos. 4, 15, 16, 25, 27, 28 and 29.

District No. 3. All of School districts Nos. 8, 9, 10, 18, 20, 22, 23, 26, 27 30, and 35.

It was regularly moved and seconded that the above division of the County into Assesment districts be and is hereby approved.
