Board met at 10 o'clock A. M. this 4th day of January A. D. 1916, in regular session as is by law required. Roll call showing present, Commissioners Robert A. Day, Ivor Christensen, Wm. A. Mc Kay, Chairman and L. B. Magor, Clerk.

Scott of Medicine Bow, Wyoming, came before the Board relative to the building of a bridge across the Little Medicine Bow River at what is known as the 32 mile crossing. Their request was given favorable consideration but the Board could not say when same could be built but agreed to build a bridge at some future date.

Mr. Geo. C. Austin, Superintendent of the S. & E. Railroad appeared before the Board as to the matter of the rebatement of the S. & E. Railroad taxes for the year 1915. No action was taken and the Board laid the matter over until the next regular meeting.

The matter of estimating the cost of maintaining the County Government for the year 1916, in compliance with Section 1132 of the Compiled Statutes of Wyoming, of 1910, was considered and after due calculation the apportionment was made as follows:-

POLL AND ROAD TAX.

Regarding the matter of collecting Poll and Road Taxes by the Assessor at the time of assessment it was regularly moved by Commissioner Christensen and seconded by Commissioner Day that all persons between the age of 21 and 50 years, inclusive, pay a poll tax of \$2.00 for school purposes in accordance with section 2320 Wyoming Compiled Statutes 1910 and also that each able bodied man in the County between the age of 21 and 50 years, inclusive, pay a special road tax of \$2.00 for road purposes according to Section 2562 Wyoming Compiled Statutes 1910. Motion Carried.
