

Board met at 10 o'clock A. M. this 8th day of January A D. 1919, pursuant to adjournment of January 7th. 1919. Roll call showing present, Commissioners R. T. Wood, A. W. Rasmussen, Wm. A. Mc Kay, Chairman and R. A. Magor, Clerk.

Proceedings were had as follows, to-wit:-

POLL AND ROAD TAX.

Regarding the matter of the collection of Poll and Road Taxes by the Assessor at the time of assessment, it was regularly moved by Commissioner Rasmussen and seconded by Commissioner Mc Kay that all persons between the age of Twenty-one and Fifty years, inclusive, pay a Poll Tax of Two (^{Dollars} \$2.00) for School Purposes in accordance with Section 2320 of the Wyoming Compiled Statutes of 1910, and also that each able-bodied man in the County between the age of Twenty-one and Fifty years, inclusive, pay a special Road Tax of Two (\$2.00) Dollars accorind to Section 2562 of the Wyoming Compiled Statutes of 1910. Motion carried.

The matter of estimating the cost of maintaining the County Government for the year, 1919, in compliance with Section 1132 of the Compiled Statutes of Wyoming, 1910, was considered and after due calculations apportionment was made as follows:- to wit:-

GENERAL FUND -----	\$49,000.00	
ROAD & BRIDGE FUND -----	\$35,000.00	or as much thereof as may be necessary.
POOR & PAUPER FUND -----	\$10,000.00	or as much thereof as may be necessary.
DISTRICT COURT FUND -----	\$ 4,000.00	or as much thereof as may be necessary.
Total -----	\$98,000.00	

Mr. James Blackhall appeared before the Board relative to the proposed road from Encampment, Wyoming, to Slater, Colorado, asking that the county appropriate the sum of \$2500.00 to covey one-half the cost of survey of said road, the government to appropriate the other half.

After due consideration it was ~~the~~ matter was laid over until some future time as it was impossible for the County to expend the amount of money required as their share on this road at this time.

Bids will be received up to 12 o'clock M. at the office of the County Clerk at Rawlins, Wyoming, February 5th. 1919. The Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids. The bids to be for a two year contract.

After due discussion, it was moved by Commissioner Rasmussen and seconded by Commissioner Mc Kay that the County purchase a C. L. Best 40 Caterpillar Tractor to be delivered not later than April, 15th. 1919. Roll call of vote. Commissioner Rasmussen, Commissioner Wood and Commissioner Mc Kay all voting aye.
