To the HONORABLE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, Rawlins, Wyoming.

Dear Sirs:-

On the 31st day of December, 1903 the S $\frac{1}{2}$  of NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 30; the N $\frac{1}{2}$  of NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of SW $\frac{1}{4}$  and the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 31, all in Township 15N., Range 83 W. of the 6th P. M., and the SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 36, Township 15 N., Range 84 W. were sold to the County as the property of J. T. Culleton and have never been redeemed.
