IN REGARD TO ROAD.

Hilton, Forest Supervisor of the Medicine Bow Forest and a Delagation of tax payers from Saratoga, appeared before the Board of County Commissioners in regard to a road from Brooklyn Lake in Albany County, through the Medicine Bow National Forest in Carbon County. The Government has \$20,000.00 toward this road and they wanted to get \$10,000.00 from the Carbon County. Owing to the fact that so many bridges went out this spring, the County Commissioners did not feel able to donate \$10,000.00 this year. RESOLVED That the Present Board of County Commissioners recommend to the new Board of County Commissioners for the next year, to help the Government to build this road.

On account of the fact that this road will pass through the mountains and forest, it will be the most scenic road in Carbon County.
