ORDER UPON APPLICATION BY PETITION OF
OTTO G. SHARRER TO INCORPORATE THE
TOWN OF HANNA, CARBON COUNTY, WYOMING

This matter coming on for hearing this 6th day of June, A. D. 1935, before the

Board, the following Commissioners being present, to-wit: Gus Larson, Frank Schilt and Eugene McCarthy, upon the petition of Otto G. Sharrer as applicant, which petition is also signed by several electors, and the Board having heard all the parties interested in such application who have appeared and asked to be heard and being sufficiently advised in the premises is satisfied and finds as follows:

1. That all requirements of Chapter 22 Wyoming Revised Statutes, 1931, in respect to such application have been complied with.

2. That a survey of the courses and distances of the boundaries of the district or territory included within the limits of the proposed incorporated Town of Hanna, Carbon County, Wyoming, has been made by R. R. Knill, licensed engineer and practical surveyor, and the said R. R. Knill has made a map of the corporate limits of said Town based upon said survey, showing the boundaries, and the aggregate quantity of land embraced within said district or territory;

that annexed to said survey and map is an affidavit of said engineer and surveyor showing the accuracy of said survey and map.

3. That said district or territory does not exceed three square miles and is not included within any presently incorporated city or town.

4. That Anna Klaseen has taken a census of the resident population of said district or territory; that said census exhibits the name of every head of a family residing within said district or territory on the day of said census and the number of persons then belonging to any such family; that said census was taken on the 15th day of May, 1935; that said census is accompanied by the affidavit of the said Anna Klaseen.

5. That the resident population of said district or territory is 1086 persons and is in excess of one hundred and fifty persons.

6. That said census, map and survey, having been completed and verified, were left on the 15th day of May, 1935, at Hanna State and Savings Bank, a convenient place within such district or territory for examination by those having an interest therein, and remained there for said purpose to and including the 5th day of June, 1935.

7. That Otto G. Sharrer did on the 15th day of May, 1935, post in three public places in said district or territory, to-wit, Hanna Amusement Hall, Hanna State and Savings Bank and Hanna Post Office, a "Notice of Intended Application to Incorporate," which said notice is in the following words and figures, to-wit:

NOTICE OF INTENDED APPLICATION TO INCORPORATE

Notice is hereby given that the undersigned will on the 4th day of June, 1935, make application to the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, for the necessary order and action to incorporate the Town of Hanna, Carbon County, Wyoming; that the boundaries of the territory to be included within said incorporated town are as follows:

"Beginning at a point which is the south quarter corner of said Section seventeen (17); thence North zero degrees forty-eight minutes twenty-three seconds East (N. 0° 48' 23" E.) a distance of two thousand six hundred fifty-nine and three tenths (2,659.3) feet to the center of said Section seventeen (17); thence South eighty-nine degrees forty-seven minutes fifty seconds West (S 89° 47' 50" W.) a distance of two thousand five hundred twenty-four and ninety-three one hundredths (2,524.93) feet to the west quarter corner of said Section seventeen (17); thence South eighty-nine degrees thirty-one minutes twelve seconds West (S 89° 31' 12" W.) a distance of five thousand one hundred fifteen and ninety-six one hundredths (5,115.96) feet to the west quarter corner of said Section eighteen (18);

thence South zero degrees thirteen minutes thirty-five seconds West (S 0°13' 35" W.) a distance of two thousand six hundred twenty-one and fifteen one hundredths (2,621.15) feet to the southwest corner of said Section eighteen (18); thence South two degrees forty-one minutes thirty-seven seconds West (S 2°41' 37" W.) a distance of two thousand five hundred eighty-five and five one hundredths (2,585.05) feet to the west quarter corner of said section nineteen (19); thence South eighty-nine degrees twenty-eight minutes thirty-three seconds East (S 89°28' 33" E.) a distance of five thousand one hundred fifty-eight and seventy-five one hundredths (5,158.75) feet to the East quarter corner of said Section nineteen (19); thence South eighty-nine degrees forty-eight minutes twenty-nine seconds East (S 89°48'29"E.) a distance of two thousand five hundred twenty-one and sixty-seven one hundredths (2,521.67) feet to the center of said Section twenty (20); thence North one degree eleven minutes one second East (N 1°11' 01" E.) a distance of two thousand six hundred fifty-two and twenty-five one hundredths (2,652.25) feet to the South quarter corner of said Section seventeen (17) and the place or point of beginning."

18. That Geanne Amoss, Robert Molyneaux and Henry Jones, are duly qualified electors residing within said district or territory proposed to be incorporated and are fully qualified as inspectors of election at an election to determine whether or not said town shall be incorporated.

19. That there is no newspaper published within the said limits or boundaries of said district or territory proposed to be incorporated as the Town of Hanna, Carbon County, Wyoming; that the Rawlins Republican is a newspaper published weekly at Rawlins in said Carbon County, Wyoming.

20. That the Community Hall at Hanna, Carbon County, Wyoming, is a convenient place within the limits of said district or territory at which to hold an election upon said petition and proposal to incorporate said town.

Said inspectors shall act as judges and clerks of the election; and they shall report the result of the election and ballot to this Board, which report shall be filed with the County Clerk of Carbon County, Wyoming. The ballots used at said election shall be "For incorporation" and "Against incorporation".

2. Permission is hereby granted to Otto G. Sharrer to attach his supplemental affidavit this day filed, to his petition filed on June 4, 1935, as a part of said petition.
