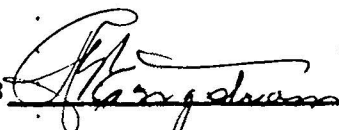

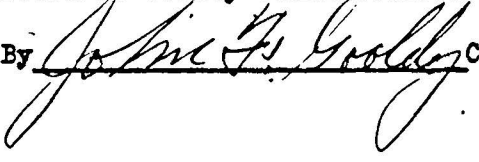
County Budget officer R. G. Engstrom, advised the Board of Commissioners that the funds set up for the District Court budget have become depleted account of unexpected Court costs, namely the Eagan case transferred from Natrona County. In compliance with Chapter 7 Section 3 of Wyoming Session Laws, 1941, a resolution was introduced by McCarthy, seconded by Hansen and unanimously carried, that \$750.00 be appropriated out of the Emergency Fund to the District Court budget.

The applications of the Rawlins Republican Bulletin and The Carbon County News for designation as official County newspaper were read and discussed by the Board. A motion was made by Hansen, seconded by McCarthy and unanimously carried, appointing the Carbon County News as the official paper of Carbon County effective June 1, 1941 to Jan. 4, 1943. The Rawlins Municipal Golf Club applied for a special beer license. Same was unanimously granted by the Board for a period of 60 days, for \$1.00. ✓

Thereupon the Board adjourned until June 9, 1941, at which time they will meet as a Board of Equalization.
