

COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS

Special Meeting

The Board of Commissioners met Aug. 14, 1941 at 10:00 o'clock A. M. all present, John F. Gooldy presiding.

S. S. Sharp advised the Board that there is an omission of 3/4 of one mill in the tax levy for building purposes, on the Certificate of Special School Tax Voted, for High School District No. 2. A motion was made by McCarthy, seconded by Hansen and unanimously carried, authorizing the County Assessor to correct the mill levy of High School District No. 2.

In compliance with Section 52-219 W. R. S. 1931, a motion was made by McCarthy, seconded by Hansen and unanimously carried, that George C. Austin, Chas. G. Vivian and Gus Larson be appointed appraisers to view and appraise the Baggs-Dixon road as proposed, and make a report of their findings to the Board of County Commissioners as soon as practicable. It was also decided that the Appraisers should meet at 9:00 A.M. Aug. 16, 1941, at the Vernon Hotel in Baggs, Wyo., and that all land owners and claimants along the proposed road, be notified. It was further decided that objections to the Board of Appraisers' report, will be heard in the office of the Board of Commissioners in the Courthouse at Rawlins, on Sept. 4, 1941.

The following tax rebates were allowed by the Board.

Richard Norris, Tax rebate order No. 1428, \$9.36 account ex-service exemption on car license tax.

Mrs. Nora V. Jepsen, Tax rebate order No. 1429, \$2.00 poll tax, account erroneous assessment.

An application was presented by Howard Corpening, for six special malt beverage licenses for Ten Mile Inc., to be issued as follows for \$10.00 each. Aug. 17-24-31 and Sept. 7-14 and 21. The Board unanimously approved this request.

The State Examiner recommended to the Board of Commissioners, that a permanent bookkeeping system be installed for receipts and expenditures of the County Fair. A motion was made by Hansen, seconded by McCarthy and carried, appointing Margaret Cathey as Treasurer of the County Fair, to install a permanent record for the County Fair funds, showing all receipts and disbursements. Purchase orders properly signed by the County Agent or Secretary of the Fair, must accompany all bills when presented to the County Fair Treasurer for payment.

Whereupon the Board adjourned, until Sept. 2, 1941.
