The liquor license application of Sam Bailey was rejected by the Board.

The financial statement of the Carbon County Memorial Hospital was presented to the Board by J. J. Hickey, Treasurer. This report was examined and placed on file.

By action of the Board, A. R. McMicken was granted authority to place a wire gate on cattle-guard / on county road between McMicken and Swanson ranch leased by Joe Craig on south Spring Creek, until such time as cattle guard can be repaired.

The monthly reports from County Officers were approved and placed on file.


A tax abatement of \$11.30 was granted to Vergal Aydelott of Encampment, account of erroneous assessment.


