The Board of Commissioners and representatives of various towns in Carbon County and representatives of the Union Pacific, Sinclair Refinery, Seminoe and Kortess Dams, met with Stanley Edwards, Deputy Director of the Wyoming Civil Defense Agency, who outlined plans for a Civil Defense Board in Carbon County. In compliance with Chapter 104, Session Laws of Wyoming, 1951, the Board unanimously adopted the following resolution to-wit:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the Legislature of the State of Wyoming has passed and the Governor has signed into law, Chapter 104, Session Laws, 1951, otherwise known as the Wyoming Civil Defense Act which Act is now in effect; and

WHEREAS Section 8 of said Act authorizes and directs each political sub-division of this State to establish a local organization in accordance with the State Civil Defense Plan which contemplates a "County-City" organization within each County; and

WHEREAS such plan will require official legal action by Carbon County to effect consummation of said plan;


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CARBON COUNTY:

(1) THAT this Board and all other elected officials and all appointed officials and employees of the County of Carbon be, and the same hereby are, authorized and directed to join with the Mayor and all other elected officials and appointed officers of the cities and towns of Carbon County for the purpose of establishing a City-County Civil Defense Unit under the provisions of the Civil Defense Act of 1951.

(2) THAT this Board and all other elected officials and all appointed officials and employees of Carbon County be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to do and perform each and every act that may be lawfully required of them by the Director of Civil Defense for the State of Wyoming under the provisions of said Wyoming Civil Defense Act, 1951.

(3) THAT this Board and all other elected officials and all appointed officials and employees of Carbon County be, and they hereby are, authorized to continue such duties as may be required of them hereunder without further specific authority regardless of the personnel occupying such county offices.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF I hereunto set my hand and affix the official seal of Carbon County this 7th day of August, A. D., 1951.

COMMISSIONERS' PROCEEDINGS  
SPECIAL MEETING

The Board of Commissioners met at 2:00 P.M., McCarthy and Cheesbrough present, Salisbury absent.

PASS CREEK ROAD: Protests and Claims for Damages were received from the Rocky Mountain Sheep Co. and G. B. Hunt, I. G. Shurigar, and Rex W. Foster against the establishment of this road.

The Board appointed Robert Taylor, of Saratoga, William H. Carey of Encampment, and O. C. Sheehan of Dixon, as appraisers on the proposed location of this road to meet Aug. 22, 1951. These appraisers will view the ground and make a report of their doings within thirty days of the date of their appointment or sooner if practicable to the County Clerk.

SPECIAL SUNDAY PERMIT No. 2730 for the sale of malt beverages was granted to the V.F.W. Auxiliary Post No. 9439 of Baggs, Wyo. for September 2, only, for the sum of \$1.00.

TRANSFER OF LIQUOR LICENSE NO. 41 A letter was received by the Board from R. S. and Alta Tully of Three Forks Filling Station, advising that they have sub-leased their business interests to Jack and Mattie Hoth of Three Forks, also requesting that Liquor License No. 41 be transferred to the new lessees for the period of Aug. 15 to Oct. 4, 1951 at which time this license expires. This request and transfer was granted by the Board.

CIVIL DEFENSE DIRECTOR. Louis M. Groh was appointed as Civil Defense Director for Carbon County in compliance with Chapter 104, Session Laws of Wyoming 1951, Wyoming Civil Defense Act as outlined by Deputy Dir. Stanley Edwards of the Wyoming Civil Defense Agency at a meeting with the Board and others, on August 7, 1951.

STATE EXAMINERS REPORTS of Annual Audit of Carbon County Offices and Carbon County Library, as of Close of Business on May 31, 1951, were received by the Board. After careful consideration of these reports, the Board unanimously agreed to concur with the suggestions of the Examiner and have instructed the various officers of the County to comply with the recommendations as submitted.
