PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 1

Proposal to amend Section 6, Article X, of the Constitution of the State of Wyoming to read and provide as follows:

"Article 10, Section 6. Corporations shall have power to engage in such and as many lines or departments of business as the legislature shall provide."

This proposed amendment would remove the limitation which presently permits a corporation to engage in but one line or department of business and would give the legislature the right by general law to prescribe the nature and number of lines or departments of business in which any corporation shall have power to engage. This will permit the legislature to modernize and bring our corporate laws up to date, and to adopt the Model Corporation Act, which has been done in other states, thereby promoting business and encouraging new industry for Wyoming.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 2

Proposal to amend Section 5, Article XVI, of the Constitution of the State of Wyoming to read and provide as follows:

"Article XVI, Section 5. No city, town or village, or any sub-division thereof, or any subdivision of any county of the State of Wyoming, shall, in any manner, create any indebtedness exceeding four (4) percentum on the assessed value of the taxable property therein; provided, however, that any city, town or village may be authorized to create an additional indebtedness, not exceeding 4 per centum on the assessed value of the taxable property therein as shown by the last preceding general assessment, for the purpose of building sewerage therein; and provided further, that any school district may be authorized to create an additional indebtedness, not exceeding 4 per centum on the assessed value of the taxable property therein as shown by the last preceding general assessment, for the purpose of the erection or enlargement of school buildings therein; debts contracted for supplying water to such city or town are excepted from the operation of this section."

This proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Wyoming allows cities, towns, villages, or subdivisions thereof to create indebtedness not to exceed four per cent (4%) of the assessed value of the taxable property within such city, town, village, or subdivision thereof, whereas the present provisions of the Constitution restrict the creation of indebtedness to two per cent (2%) of the assessed value of taxable property.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT NO. 3

Proposal to amend Section 6, Article XV, of the Constitution of the State of Wyoming to read and provide as follows:

"Article XV, Section 6. No incorporated city or town shall levy a tax to exceed twelve (12) mills on the dollar in any one year, except for the payment of its public debt and the interest thereon."

This proposed amendment to the Constitution of the State of Wyoming, allows cities and towns to increase their tax levies to twelve (12) mills instead of the present maximum of eight (8) mills.
