DISTRICT COURT COMMISSIONERS. The Board confirmed the appointment of two additional Commissioners for Carbon County, Wyoming who were appointed by District Court Judges Bentley and Stanton effective June 4, 1964. J. Reuel Armstrong and Eph U. Johnson received the appointments.

SEMINOE DAM ROAD: The Commissioners entered into an agreement with the Wyoming Highway Department for completion of the Seminoe Dam Road to the reclamation boundary near the dam. The project will involve about five miles of County Farm-to-Market Road 351 which runs north from Sinclair.

THE BAGGS CEMETERY DISTRICT: The Board of Carbon County Commissioners convened on Wednesday July 8, 1964 at 10:00 A. M. for the purpose of considering the petition of certain property owners requesting the establishment of a Special Cemetery District in the Old Sand Creek and Baggs School Districts and legally described as follows: Ranges 91, 92 and 93 West of the 6th P.M., Carbon County, Wyoming. Townships 13, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19 and all of Township 12 situated in Carbon County, Wyoming.


The Certificate of Reino Hakala, County Assessor of Carbon County, Wyoming, whereby he certified that the property owners signing the petition requesting the establishment of the District comprised twenty-five percent (25%) or more of the Property Owners within the proposed district and the persons so signing also comprised and owned Twenty-five percent (25%) or more of the assessed valuation of the property within the proposed district.

George R. Salisbury, Jr. Chairman of the Board, then opened the hearing for protests concerning any and all matters affecting the creation of the proposed district. There were no protests entered, whatsoever, on the establishment of the district. The Chairman then stated that the hearing would be adjourned and that for a period of Thirty (30) days after the adjournment of the hearing written protests maybe filed by owners of property within the proposed district. The Chairman stated that the protest period would expire on Friday, August 7, 1964. If written protests signed by the owners of at least Thirty-five percent (35%) of the assessed valuation of property within the proposed district are filed the district shall fail. If the number of written protests filed are less than Thirty-five percent (35%), then the Board of County Commissioners shall order an Election to be held within Sixty (60) days after the expiration of the Thirty (30) day protest period.

The hearing was then adjourned.


