A regular meeting of the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, was held at the hour of 10 o'clock a.m., pursuant to due notice and call, at Commissioners's Room of Carbon County Courthouse at Rawlins, Wyoming, on Tuesday the 3rd day of March, 1964.

The Chairman called the meeting to order and upon roll call the following were found to be present:

Present: George R. Salisbury, Jr. and other Commissioners John Niland and John Orton.

Absent: None constituting all the members of the Board.

There were also present: County Clerk: R. G. Engstrom

County Attorney: Absent

The following proceedings, among others, were held and taken:

Thereupon, Commissioner Niland introduced and moved the adoption of the following resolution, which was thereupon read in full and is as follows:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Town Clerk of the Town of Saratoga, in the County of Carbon and State of Wyoming, has transmitted a certified copy of an ordinance adopted and approved by the Town Council of the Town of Saratoga, on the 21st day of February, 1964, to the County Clerk for the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined, and does hereby determine, that it is necessary and for the best interest of the Town of Saratoga, and the county, and its inhabitants, to provide for the authorization and issuance of said bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$67,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the sewerage system of the Town of Saratoga.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF CARBON COUNTY, STATE OF WYOMING:

Section 1. That all action heretofore taken by the Town Council of the Town of Saratoga, the officers thereof, and the officers of Carbon County, directed toward submitting the question of issuing the sewer revenue

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bonds of said Town in the aggregate principal amount of \$67,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary for the purpose of defraying the cost of extending and improving the sewerage system of said Town, be, and the same hereby is, ratified, approved and confirmed, including, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, the adoption by said Town Council of said ordinance on the 21st day of February, 1964, and all action taken pursuant thereto.

Section 2. That the County Clerk shall give notice of the action hereby taken by transmitting to the Clerk of said Town of Saratoga, Wyoming, for said Town Council, a certified copy of this resolution.

Section 3. That the officers of the County of Carbon, be, and they hereby are, authorized and directed to take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this resolution and Ordinance No. 234, passed and adopted on the 21st day of February, 1964, by the Town Council of the Town of Saratoga, Wyoming.

Section 4. That all resolutions or parts thereof in conflict with this resolution are hereby repealed.

Section 5. That if any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this resolution shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this resolution.

Section 6. That by reason of the fact that said Town is not properly or adequately supplied with sewerage facilities, it is hereby declared that an emergency exists, that this resolution is necessary to the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and that it shall be in full force and effect immediately after its adoption and approval.

Section 7. That this resolution shall be entered on record in the minute book of the Board of County Commissioners, and the County Clerk is authorized and directed to carry out the provisions thereof.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, P. T. Anderberg, Engineering Department, C. E. Stone, Traffic Agent, and Harold M. Johnson all representing the Union Pacific Railroad Company appeared and requested that that certain portion of FAP Route 22-(Wyo. 130) located in Carbon County, Wyoming, which has been removed from the state highway system by resolution of the Wyoming Highway Commission passed and adopted May 23, 1963, be retained as a public highway commencing at a point on the south right of way boundary of the presently existing Ryan Park, Wyoming, No. 130 road, Project S-0103 (2), situated in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 16, T 16 N, R 83 W of the 6th P. M., Wyoming, thence running southeasterly through Sections 16 and 21, T.16 N, R 83 W to a point at the Southwest corner of the Union Pacific Railroad's land upon which is located loading pens adjacent to the S & E Railroad line in Carbon County, Wyo., and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED That the Board of County Commissioners if requested at any time in the future, to abandon the aforesaid road as described above, have agreed to notify the Union Pacific Railroad Company of such intention at least thirty days before action of abandonment is taken by the Board of County Commissioners.

COLORADO STATE LINE-RIVERSIDE ROAD, PROJECT S-0401 (1) 2: A motion was made by Orton, seconded by Niland and carried whereby the following resolution was adopted to wit:

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners have decided to locate a road to be known as Colorado State Line- Riverside Road, Project S-0401 (1) 2, and

WHEREAS, the Notice of Location containing the description of the proposed road was published in the Rawlins Daily Times on December 6, 13 and 20, 1963, and

WHEREAS, no claims have been filed within the time shown on the Notice of Location, and the necessary easements have been signed by C. A. and Lottie V. McKee, husband and wife, and Nelson E. Wren,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the road as described above and shown in detail on the map on file with the County Clerk, be and is hereby declared established and a notice be sent to Wyoming Highway Department, Cheyenne, Wyoming.

WHEREAS, UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD COMPANY has tendered to COUNTY OF CARBON, State of Wyoming, an agreement covering a water pipe line on, along and under the surface of land of the Railroad Company, near Hanna, Carbon County, Wyoming; said agreement being identified as Union Pacific Railroad Company's C.D. No. 47777-1; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of County of Carbon, State of Wyoming, has said proposed agreement before it and has given it careful review and consideration; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that said Board endorses and supports S2525, a Bill introduced and sponsored by Senator Mansfield, Senator McGee, Senator Simpson and others to restrict importing of beef, veal and mutton into the United States; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to Senator McGee, Senator Simpson and Congressman Harrison.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the Savery-Pot Hook project, approved in principle by the Upper Colorado River Commission as an integral part of the agricultural development of the upper basin in Colorado and Wyoming; and
