REVENUE SHARING HEARING

A Revenue Sharing hearing was held at 10:00 for the purpose of allocating monies for the following priorities: \$195,000 - Transportation, \$100,000 - Health, 10,013 - Recreation. No protests were entered.

CARBON COUNTY PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION

Motion was made by Martin McMahon, seconded by Emil Lemich and unanimously carried to amend the first paragraph, page one, of the Carbon County Zoning Ordinance of 1972 to read:

"BE IT ORDAINED by the County Commissioners, Carbon County, Wyoming, pursuant to the authority conferred by the provisions of Chapter 6, Sections 18-289.1 through 18-289.8 and Sections 18-281 through 18-289 of the Wyoming Statutes as follows:" (Ref. case file 77-1A)

Motion was made by Martin McMahon, seconded by Emil Lemich and unanimously carried to amend Section #600 of the Carbon County Zoning Ordinance of 1972 by adding alphabetically the following:

"PRIMARY RESIDENCE, A place used for residential purposes during the time in which the household head(s) is (are) employed and not on vacation. For retired and unemployed persons, the primary residence is one occupied by him more than three months in a year."

to the List of Definitions, pages 39-47. (Ref. case file 77-2A)

Motion was made by Emil Lemich, seconded by Martin McMahon, and unanimously carried to amend Section #300 (District Regulations), Subsection #310 (Ram District) of the Carbon County Zoning Ordinance of 1972 to read as follows:

"The purpose of this District is to preserve open areas of the County while at the same time permit ranching, agriculture, animal husbandry, forestry and mining in a manner which attains this purpose. Primary Residential uses not related to ranching and agriculture will not be permitted within this district. If such uses are desired, a zone change to RD (Residential Development) should be sought. Concerning the development of new primary residential areas to be located a substantial distance from already established communities, the Carbon County Comprehensive Plan contains land use policies which discourage such developments, except when unavoidable. The purpose of this policy is to strengthen existing communities and to make maximum use of the services already established for police and fire protection, trash collection, snow removal and other public services. The criterion used in deciding whether or not to grant a zone change to RD will be consideration as to whether the establishment of a new separate community is unavoidable because of the remote location of new employment." (Ref. case file 77-3A)

Motion was made by Martin McMahon, seconded by Emil Lemich and unanimously carried to amend Section #400 (Supplementary Regulations), Subsection #460 (Special Permit Use Requirements) of the Carbon County Zoning Ordinance of 1972 to read as follows:

"Due to their unusual and unique features, Special Permit Uses shall be subject to the following requirements to insure the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of Carbon County citizens. Special Permit Uses shall be permitted in Districts where designated only after review and approval by the Planning and Zoning Commission. The basic criterion to be used in reviewing applications for special permit uses shall be whether or not granting the permit for development either by itself or in combination with other developments will subvert the stated purpose of the established District. If so, the permit shall be denied and the petitioner will have the option of requesting a zone change. Appeals of decisions and conditions made by the Planning and Zoning Commission may be taken to the Board of County Commissioners." (Ref. case file 77-4A)

Motion was made by Emil Lemich, seconded by Martin McMahon and unanimously carried to amend Section I (Title, Authority), Subsection 1.3 (Purpose) of the Carbon County Subdivision Ordinance of 1972 to read as follows:

"This resolution is designed and enacted to supplement the requirements of Wyoming Laws, Chapter 6, Sections 18-281 to 18-289 (1955) and Chapter 6.1, Sections 18-289.1 to 18-289.9 (1967) and Sections 18-289.10 through 18-289.24, for the purpose of promoting the public health..... in order to protect the best interests of the public." (Ref. case file 77-5A)

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Motion was made by Martin McMahon, seconded by Emil Lemich and unanimously carried to amend Section #IV (Procedures), Subsection #4.5 (Supporting Data), Item "g" of the Carbon County Subdivision Ordinance of 1972 to read as follows:

"G" Proof that potential users of the subdivision will have legal access to the subdivision as required by the circumstances of each individual applicant. An indication that users will have the right to travel over lands between public roads and the subdivision should be provided." (Ref. case file 77-6A)

Motion was made by Emil Lemich, seconded by Martin McMahon and unanimously carried to amend Section #VI (Mountain Subdivisions), Subsection #6.1 (Roads) of the Carbon County Subdivision Ordinance of 1972 to read the same as present with the last paragraph amended as follows:

"At least two means of access shall be provided to the subdivision so that all lots within the subdivision are ensured adequate access and egress in the event of fire, flooding, slides, or other emergency conditions. The County may, at its discretion, require that more than two points of access be provided to satisfy the purposes of this section. Evidence should be provided that legal access between public roads and the two or more points of access (on the subdivision boundaries) is provided for potential buyers." (Ref. case file 77-7A)

Motion was made by Emil Lemich, seconded by Martin McMahon and unanimously carried to amend Section #400 (Supplementary Regulations), Subsection #463 (Mobile Home Parks), Item 463.6 of the Carbon County Zoning Ordinance of 1972 to read as follows:

"463.6. The development of plans for mobile home parks shall include measures to control dust such as placement of gravel, oiling of grades, areas, or planting of grass or other ground cover." (ref. case file 77-11A)

To comply with Wyoming Statute 18-289, appointment of a Deputy County Clerk will be made to serve as secretary to the Carbon County Planning and Zoning Commission.

Vondrasek dba Red Hills Service Station, Rawlins, Wyoming, License No. 363, for the period 10-7-77 to 10-7-78. They also granted a Retail Malt Beverage Permit to Max B. INDUSTRIAL ROAD PROJECT - SHIRLEY BASIN ACCESS ROAD

R E S O L U T I O N

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, are duly assembled in a regular meeting in the Courthouse Bldg., Rawlins, Wyoming, this 5th day of October, 1977; and

WHEREAS, request for the establishment for an Industrial Road pursuant to Title 24, Chapter 4.1, Wyoming Statutes, 1957, has been made; and

WHEREAS, said Industrial Road will commence at the juncture of State Highway 75 and then proceed easterly through Sections 19 and 20, Township 27 North, Range 78 West of the 6th P.M., a distance of 6,290 feet, average width of thirty (30) feet and terminate at the present pavement in the Shirley Basin Townsite, Carbon County, Wyoming; and

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WHEREAS, said Board finds that the public interest so requires the establishment of said Industrial Road; and

WHEREAS, the Board further finds that a road building emergency prevails and that the procedure for the establishment of an Industrial Road should be invoked; and

WHEREAS, the course and point of termination of said Industrial Road shall be approximately as proposed on preliminary survey as set forth on Exhibit "A" attached hereto and by this reference expressly made a part hereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

1. That the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, deems the public interest requires that said above described Industrial Road be established.

2. That a road building emergency prevails and that the provisions of Title 24, Chapter 4.1, Wyoming Statutes, 1957, should be forthwith invoked.

3. That the County Clerk shall immediately notify the State Highway Commission of the State of Wyoming of intention to establish said proposed Industrial Road and said County Clerk shall forthwith forward a copy of this Resolution to said State of Wyoming Highway Commission, P.O. Box 1708, Cheyenne, Wyoming 82001.

4. That one viewer shall be appointed by the Board of County Commissioners, pursuant to Section 24.69.3, Wyoming Statutes, 1957.

5. That said viewers shall forthwith report in writing to said Board.

6. That said viewers shall be allowed reasonable compensation for their services, said compensation to be determined by this Board.
