CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

Amendment No. 1 - Article 9, Section 3 of the Wyoming Constitution prohibits any female and all boys under the age of fourteen from working in the mines. This amendment would remove the restrictions and allow adult females to be employed in mines. Minor children are prohibited from working in mines by existing state and federal laws.

Amendment No. 2 - This amendment will eliminate the necessity for an annual census of school age children, and will permit the Wyoming Legislature to provide that income attributable to permanent monies for the support of schools shall be allocated equitably among all school districts in the state.

Amendment No. 3 - This amendment will allow the legislature to authorize the building of a state penitentiary for men outside the corporate limits of the City of Rawlins and to locate a state penitentiary for women at the most advantageous place in Wyoming. The amendment also permits the establishment of other public institutions without a vote of the people and changes the name of the "insane Asylum" to the "state hospital".

ONE PERCENT COUNTY SALES TAX

Question submitted: "Shall the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Carbon, State of Wyoming, be authorized to impose an excise tax within Carbon County, Wyoming, for the purpose of general revenue at the rate of One percent (1%) upon retail sales of tangible personal property and other transactions authorized by Section 39-291, Wyoming Statutes, 1957, as amended?"

PROPOSED HIGHWAY CHANGES

Proposal for relocating Highway U.S. 30 and business route Interstate 80 in Rawlins, Wyoming from the present route on Cedar Street between Third and Fifth Streets and on Fifth Street between Cedar and Spruce Street.

NOVEMBER 14 (within Seven Days after the General)

Last day for every political action committee and candidate's campaign committee to file a fully itemized statement of receipts and expenditures. Sec. 22.1-389.6 (b)

FILING OFFICES - Sec. 22.1-389.7

County Clerk - Supporting a candidate for a municipal, county, judicial, school or college board office, or a local ballot proposition.

County Clerk and Secretary of State - Supporting a candidate for a state legislative or district judgeship office.

Secretary of State - Supporting a candidate for a statewide office, or a statewide ballot proposition.

Last day for any person, firm, corporation, association or organization selling or supplying campaign advertising or materials to file report with the Secretary of State. Sec. 22.1-389.11.

Last day for the chairman of each political party central committee for the state or county to file an itemized statement of receipts and expenditures. Sec. 22.1-389.6 (d)

-- County party central committee to file with the Secretary of State and the County Clerk

-- State party central committee to file with the Secretary of State.

NOVEMBER 17 (Within 10 days after the General)

Last day for candidates to file a statement of receipts and expenditures.

Filing Offices - Sec. 22.1-389.7

County Clerk - Candidates for municipal, county, judicial, school or college board offices.

County Clerk and Secretary of State - Candidates for state legislative or district judgeship offices.

Secretary of State - Candidates for statewide offices.
