JUSTICES OF THE PEACE

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5-4-207, Wyoming Statutes, 1977, the Supreme Court of Wyoming is vested with supervisory powers over Justice Courts of the State of Wyoming; and  
WHEREAS, the said Supreme Court of Wyoming has established two (2) Justice Courts and districts in Carbon County, Wyoming; and  
WHEREAS, the area of Carbon County, Wyoming, is about eight thousand (8,000) square miles and its population is about sixteen thousand (16,000) people; and  
WHEREAS, as presently constituted many of the residents of Carbon County, Wyoming, must travel one hundred (100) to two hundred (200) miles to get to a Justice Court in said county; and  
WHEREAS, Section 5-4-201(a) gives the Board of County Commissioners of each county the authority to designate additional Justices of the Peace, and  
WHEREAS, it is the considered opinion of the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, that said county should be constituted with six (6) Justice Courts.  
NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County create the following Justice of the Peace positions at the salary and locations set forth below:

- A. Medicine Bow: salary \$450.00 per month.
- B. Dixon: salary \$450.00 per month.
- C. Saratoga: salary \$700.00 per month.
- D. Elk Mountain: salary \$700.00 per month.
- E. Rawlins (2): salary \$1,250.00 per month.

The qualifications for appointment to the Justice of the Peace positions for Medicine Bow, Dixon, Saratoga, and Elk Mountain shall be as follows:

- A. must reside within the municipality selected as a site of a justice court, provided that if the Board of County Commissioners finds extraordinary circumstances to exist which warrant an exception to the residence requirement it may present its findings, including an assurance that the Justice will be available as provided in subdivision (D) of this Rule, and appropriate request to the Supreme Court that an Order be granted allowing such exception.



- B. must be a qualified elector of the county. January 2, 1979
- C. must be of good moral character and have a good reputation in the community.
- D. must be available and willing to perform the duties of a Justice at all times of the day or night.
- E. must agree to attend, and attend, the first available training school after election or appointment and each training school thereafter while in office, or be subject to disciplinary action.
- F. must agree to comply with all constitutional provisions, statutes, rules and regulations pertaining to the office of Justice of the Peace, and to submit such reports and data as required by the Supreme Court.

The qualifications for the positions in Rawlins shall be as set forth above, provided that the Justices of the Peace in Rawlins shall also be authorized to practice law in the State of Wyoming. The election of Margie M. Meacham to one of the positions in Rawlins is hereby ratified and confirmed.

It is further resolved that the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, will accept written applications for all of the positions created herein above, except the position filled by the election of Margie M. Meacham in Rawlins until 10:00 A.M., January 24, 1979. Such applications shall be in the form of a letter addressed to the Board of County Commissioners and shall be filed with the office of the County Clerk, Courthouse Building, Rawlins, Wyoming.
