THAYER INTERCHANGE & PENITENTIARY ROAD - CTR 7487

THIS AGREEMENT IS ENTERED INTO ON THIS 3rd day of June, A.D., 1980, between Carbon County herein referred to as the "Landowners" and Wyoming State Highway Department, herein referred to as the "Department".

WITNESSETH: that

WHEREAS, the Department wishes to secure for highway purposes the real property shown on the engineering plans, herein called "the property", a copy of which is attached to this agreement and which has been submitted to and received by the Landowners; and

WHEREAS, the Landowners have agreed to sell the property to the Department together with all improvements located thereon, except as otherwise stated in this agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Department will prepare a Warranty Deed with a legal description of the property described briefly as follows: A portion of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 20, T.21N, R87W, of the 6th P.M., Wyoming containing 20,953 square feet more or less and being more particularly described on said Warranty Deed, (described as follows);

All that portion of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 20, T. 21N, R87W. of the 6th P.M, Wyoming, being described by metes and bounds as follows: Beginning at a point on the south boundary of said NE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ from which the southeast corner thereof bears N. 89°53' 58.15"E. a distance of 298.73 feet; thence S. 89°53' 58.15" W. along said south boundary a distance of 121.77 feet; thence N. 09° 40' 32.1" E. a distance of 124.09 feet to a point on the southeasterly right of way boundary of the Sage Creek Road; thence N. 54°16' 09.29" E. along said southeasterly right of way boundary a distance of 170.92 feet; thence S. 09° 40' 32.1" W. a distance of 225.12 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning. The above described parcel of land contains 20,953 square feet, more or less.

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PROMISES CONTAINED IN THIS AGREEMENT, the parties agree to the following terms:

1. The Landowners will pay all real property taxes on the property for the current year, when due and/or payable, and for all prior years. The Department will reimburse the Landowner for its pro rata portion of the real property taxes for the remainder of the year computed from the date of this agreement. The pro rata portion shall be based upon the assessment of the property for the current year. If available. If the current year's assessment is not available, the previous year's assessment will be used to prorate taxes.

2. The consideration stated herein is full compensation for all of the Landowners' interest, including interests in State or Federal Land Leases, and any and all other legal and equitable interests, which are or may be outstanding, and the Landowners agree to release these interest.

3. The Landowners will terminate at their expense all existing leases or rental agreements, including advertising sign leases, affecting any portion of the property and will notify any lessees of such action.

4. The Landowners will secure a partial or full release of mortgage, as the case may be, from any outstanding mortgage covering the property. The Department will pay all reasonable mortgage release service fees and, when necessary, any penalty costs for

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prepayment of any preexisting recorded mortgage against the property.

5. The Landowners have received a copy of the Department's relocation assistance brochure and any benefits to which they may be entitled have been explained by the Department. The Landowners do not request relocation benefits for moving personal property, replacement housing, or business or farm displacement, to the extent of their eligibility under Wyoming law.
6. The Department will replace in kind, relocate or construct, of suitable size, culverts, ditches and related facilities necessary for restoration of the Landowners' present irrigation system. The Landowners grant the right to the Department and its contractors, the right of access to temporarily operate machinery within the designated construction permit areas in order to make the restoration, as shown on the attached plans.
7. The Department will fence the property before any other construction work is started. The fencing will be maintained by the Department.
8. There is excepted and reserved from the property all oil, gas, and other minerals that can be removed from the ground without jeopardy to the maintenance or safety of public use or travel upon the surface estate and without using the surface of the property.
9. This Memorandum of Agreement is the entire Agreement, and there are no additional promises, terms or obligations between the parties.
10. The Landowners relinquish to the Department all their rights of access between the remaining portions of the Landowners' lands and the property herein conveyed.
11. The Landowner hereby grants premission to the Department, it's agents and contractors to enter upon the following areas for construction. The permits for said areas are to be located outside of and adjacent to the right of way lines and will be of the following widths and lengths: (1) 10 feet wide left of Eng. Sta. 4+00.01 to Eng. Sta. 5+25.82; (2) 15 feet wide right of Eng. Sta. 4+22 to Eng. Sta. 6+68.9. The Landowner hereby grants permission to the Department it's agents and contractors to operate machinery in the construction permit areas and upon completion of construction those areas that were disturbed will be sloped, blended and reseeded where necessary.

The Department agrees to pay to the Landowners the sum of Nine Thousand One Hundred Ten and no/100 dollars \$9,110.00. If requested, the Landowners will provide an abstract of title for examination purposes. Before final payment is made by the Department, the Department may make a title examination to determine if sufficient title to the property is vested in the Landowners. The Department will pay all costs of any necessary abstracting.

The Landowners grant the Department and its contractors the right of immediate entry on the property for survey and preliminary plan preparation. Prior to the date of physical possession of the property by the Department, payment in full will be made. The Department will pay 75% of the agreed price to the Landowners with the remaining 25% to be paid upon acceptance of the title and fulfillment of the other terms of this agreement. In the event of unacceptable title, the Landowners will cooperate with the Department to clear the title. However, the Department will pay all costs for quiet title actions, court orders, and any similar expenses incidental to conveying the property to the Department.
