## ROAD VACATION NO. 630

A motion was made by Lemich and seconded by McMahon to adopt the following Resolution:

## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS a Petition has been submitted to vacate County Road 630 which was obtained by the County from the State of Wyoming, at the time that portion of Highway 230 was abandoned by the State of Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, any person interested in the proposed action was given an opportunity to protest, one protest having been received from Winthrop C. Condict, and Elsie E. Condict, and the County Commissioners having held a public hearing on the matter and being advised in the premises;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, that County Road 630 be vacated over the following described real property, to-wit:

All that portion of the land described hereinbelow except that portion in Section 16, Township 16 North, Range 83 West of the 6th P.M.

"That portion of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , SW $\frac{1}{4}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ , NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$ , and the W $\frac{1}{2}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 16, the W $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$ , E $\frac{1}{2}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$ , and the SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 21, the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 28, the E $\frac{1}{2}$ NE $\frac{1}{4}$  and the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 29, all of Township 16 North, Range 83 West of the 6th P.M., Wyoming, being the description of a parcel of land of a total width of 80 feet, being 40 feet on either side of, and equidistant from a centerline described as follows,

Beginning at a point on the southerly right of way boundary of presently existing Wyoming Highway 130 which is 170 feet, more or less, easterly along the said southerly right of way boundary from a point on the north-south centerline of said Section 16 from which the center quarter corner thereof bears southerly a distance of 520 feet, more or less.

Thence S. 26°10'E., paralleling the west right of way line, of the Saratoga and Encampment Railroad, 2690 feet, more or less to a point of a 15° curve to the right the radius of which is 382 feet; thence along said curve through an angle of 52°40', 351.1 feet. Leave railroad. Thence S. 26°30'W., 6009.8 feet to a point of a 3° curve to the right, the radius of which is 1909.9 feet; thence along said curve through an angle of 8°25', 313.9 feet; thence S. 35°55' W., 998 feet to a point of a 5° curve to the left the radius of which is 1145.9 feet; thence along said curve through an angle of 15° 300 feet; thence S. 20°55' W, 2810 feet, more or less to a point on the easterly right of way boundary of presently existing Wyoming Highway 230.

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Said parcel of land containing 24.7 acres, more or less.

BE IT RESOLVED that this vacation shall not be effective until such time as the Plattoga Limited Partnership has granted an easement for ingress, egress, regress and all utilities along that portion of the roadway from the northern boundary of Section 21, Township 16 North, Range 83 West of the 6th P.M., to the northern boundary of the Cow Creek Subdivision along the previously abandoned County Road 630. The said easement shall be 60 feet in width and shall be granted to Winthrop C. Condict and Elsie E. Condict, their executors, administrators, successors and assigns to serve the land in the Cow Creek Subdivision.

FIREWORKS

A motion was made by McMahon and seconded by Lemich to adopt the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the danger of pyrotechnics constitutes a clear and compelling danger to persons and property in Carbon County, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners is empowered by the so-called police powers to regulate dangerous activity in the county;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, as follows:

Section 1 - Definitions

A. "Pyrotechnics" means and includes any article, device, or substance prepared for the primary purpose of producing a visual or auditory sensation by combustion, explosion, deflagration, or detonation, including, without limitation, the following articles and devices commonly known and used as fireworks; toy cannons or toy canes in which explosives are used, blank cartridges, firecrackers, torpedoes, sky rockets, roman candles, and daygo bombs, soft shell firecrackers exceeding 1/2 inch in length and 1/8 inch in diameter, sparklers, vesuvius fountains, spray foundations, torches, color fire cones, star and comet type aerial shells with or without explosive charge for the purpose of making a noise, and color wheels.

B. "Person" shall include an individual, partnership, co-partnership, firm, company, association or corporation.

Section 2

It shall be unlawful for any person to offer for sale, expose for sale or sell any pyrotechnics in Carbon County, Wyoming.

Section 3

This resolution shall be deemed an additional regulation upon the sale of pyrotechnics in Carbon County, Wyoming, and in no way shall be construed to limit the State Statutes governing fireworks which otherwise apply.

Section 4

This resolution shall be effective August 1, 1980.

Section 5

Any person found guilty of violating the terms of this resolution shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) to which may be added imprisonment in the County Jail not to exceed 90 days.

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Each day pyrotechnics are offered for sale shall constitute a separate offense as shall each sale transaction.
