SPECIAL MEETING

A motion was made by McMahon and seconded by Lemich to adopt the following Resolution:

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Wyoming Attorney General has issued an opinion which provides that appointments to the positions of Justices of the Peace shall be valid only until the next general election; and,

WHEREAS, the Wyoming Legislature has deleted the requirement that the Justices of the Peace be qualified to practice law in the State of Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, there has existed ambiguity in the past concerning what portions of the county will vote for which Justice of the Peace position or positions,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming, that all qualified electors of Carbon County, Wyoming, vote on each of the Justice of the Peace positions in Carbon County, Wyoming.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the requirement that the Justices of the Peace in Rawlins, Carbon County, Wyoming be qualified to practice law is hereby eliminated in accordance with the state statutes.

September 9, 1980 - Primary Election Day

August 9, 1980 is last day to register with County or City Clerk before Primary Election Day and voter registration is also premitted at the polls on Primary Election Day.

In accordance with Section 22-2-109, Wyoming Statutes 1977, Public Notice is hereby given that a Primary Election will be held in Twenty-four polling Districts and Precincts of Carbon County, on Tuesday, September 9, 1980, for the purpose of nominating the following officers to-wit:

CAMPAIGN REPORTING REQUIREMENTS, 22-25-106. W.S. 1977 - All Candidates whether successful or not must file a statement of campaign receipts and expenditures by September 16, 1980;

FILING OFFICES, 22-25-107, W.S. 1977 - Candidates for municipal, County, judicial, school or college board offices file with the County Clerk. Candidates for state legislative or district judgeship offices file with the County Clerk and Secretary of State. Candidates for statewide offices file with the Secretary of State.

A candidate who fails to file a full and complete itemized statement within the time required is guilty of a misdemeanor and no such candidate shall receive a certificate of nomination or election nor shall he enter upon the duties of the office, and a vacancy shall exist.
