CARBON COUNTY ROAD & BRIDGE

G. Frank Smith, Road Supervisor, and Sam Verplancke, Maintenance Supervisor, met with the Commissioners to discuss policies for the Road & Bridge Department. The Supervisors will draft the policies to be approved by the Commissioners.

CARBON COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICE AGENCY

Allen Bergstrand, Coordinator, presented an agency progress report to the Commissioners. The State will fund \$60,000.00 toward an emergency operating center if a suitable location for the center is available.

SINCLAIR GOLF COURSE ROAD

Elmer Peterson asked that the County furnish a cattle guard to be installed on the Golf Course Road. The matter will be taken under advisement.

October 6, 1981

CARBON COUNTY MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

Members of the Hospital Board met with the Commissioners to acquaint them with Touche Ross & Company, a consulting firm hired by the Hospital to rectify problems involving billing and collections.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned until the following day.

October 7, 1981

The Board resumed its session at 10:00 A.M. on October 7, 1981. Commissioners Lemich, McMahon and Grieve were present; Grieve, Chairman.

CARBON COUNTY INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT COMMISSION

After reviewing the progress report with Charles Greenhawt, Chairman of the Carbon County Industrial Development Commission, a motion was made by Lemich, seconded by McMahon, and unanimously carried to authorize the expenditure of up to \$20,000.00 by the Carbon County Industrial Development Commission for a County co-ordinated effort in assessing the possibility of attracting and locating potential new business ventures, or the expansion of existing businesses, in an effort to expand and improve the economic base of Carbon County.

COUNTY SURVEYOR

A motion was made by Lemich and seconded by McMahon and unanimously carried to terminate the surveying contract of G. Frank Smith. Said contract was dated March 4, 1981. *Ron*

ENCAMPMENT SENIOR CENTER

A motion was made by Lemich, seconded by McMahon, and unanimously carried to approve the lease of Block 7, Lots 13-20 inclusive of the Town of Grand Encampment by and between the Town of Encampment and the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Carbon, Wyoming, for the purpose of constructing a Senior Citizens' Center. The term of the lease shall be 50 years, commencing August 31, 1981 and ending August 31, 2031.

THE TOWN OF SARATOGA-CARBON COUNTY, IMPACT JOINT POWERS BOARD AGREEMENT

A motion was made by McMahon, seconded by Lemich, and unanimously carried to amend Section 3 of the Town of Saratoga, Carbon County, Impact Joint Powers Board Agreement.

AMENDMENT TO SECTION 3 OF THE TOWN OF SARATOGA, CARBON COUNTY, IMPACT JOINT POWERS BOARD AGREEMENT

THAT AGREEMENT entered into the 23rd day of September, 1976, between the Town of Saratoga, hereinafter referred to as "Saratoga," and Carbon County, Wyoming, a body politic and corporate, hereinafter referred to as "Carbon County," is hereby amended in applicable parts this 21st day of September, 1981 as follows, to-wit:

WHEREAS paragraph 3 of the Impact and Joint Powers agreement approved by the State under date of September 23, 1976, has proven cumbersome and unworkable; and

WHEREAS it is the desire of the parties of said agreement to amend it in the following particulars:

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants herein contained, it is understood and agreed between the parties as follows:

Section 1. Section 3 of the original Impact Joint Powers agreement is amended to read as follows:

There is hereby created pursuant to Sections 9-18.3 through 9-18.20 Wyoming Statutes, 1957, as amended, the Town of Saratoga, Carbon County, Impact Joint Powers Board hereinafter referred to as "the Board".

A. The Board shall consist of seven (7) members, all qualified electors of Carbon County, Wyoming, four (4) of whom shall be residents of Saratoga and three (3) of whom may be residents of Carbon County residing outside the Town of Saratoga. As of the effective date of this amendment or the date of approval of this amendment by the Attorney General of the State of Wyoming, whichever date shall occur last, the Board now existing shall reorganize itself with the members thereof staggering their terms so that two members have terms of one year, two members have terms of two years and three members have terms of three years all expiring on the 31st day of July of their last year.

B. All appointments hereafter made shall be for a three year term and members shall be eligible for reappointment. At least one (1) member sitting on the Board as a resident of Saratoga shall be an elected official of the Town of Saratoga and upon expiration of said official's elective term, his seat on the Board shall be concurrently vacated without any further action and another elected official of the Town of Saratoga shall be appointed to serve the remainder of the term. Members shall be appointed by the Saratoga Town Council and the Carbon County Commissioners respectively on or before June 1st of each year. Vacancies for the remainder of a term shall be filled in the same manner.

C. Upon its reorganization, the Board shall adopt such policies, by-laws, and regulations, not inconsistent with the agreement or the Wyoming Joint Powers Act, as it deems necessary to carry on the business of the Board.

CERTIFICATE OF COMPLIANCE  
(No Relocation Required)

Pursuant to Section 16(h) of the Airport and Airway Development Act of 1970, as amended, we certify that in the acquisition of parcel(s) 7 and 10 as shown on Exhibit "A" of project number 5-56-0023-01 all requirements of Title III of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 and Subpart I of Part 25 of the regulations of the Office of the Secretary of Transportation were fully observed.

The requirements of the Act and Regulations were observed by:

1. Having the property appraised by qualified appraiser(s).
2. Affording the owner or his designated representative an opportunity to accompany the appraiser during the appraisal process.
3. Having a qualified review appraiser determine that the appraisal report conforms to the requirements and standards of the "Uniform Appraisal Standards for Federal Land Acquisitions."
4. Establishing an amount, not less than the approved appraised value as just compensation for the property.
5. Making a written offer to the landowner to acquire the property for the amount determined to be just compensation.
6. Paying the agreed purchase price.

CARBON COUNTY EMERGENCY SERVICES AGENCY

A motion was made by Lemich, seconded by McMahon, and unanimously carried to approve an agreement between Carbon County and Ruth Bergstrand, to coordinate local agencies for response to any emergency situation.

MEDICINE BOW SENIOR CENTER

A motion was made by Lemich, seconded by McMahon, and unanimously carried to approve the lease agreement between the Board of Trustees of Carbon County School District #2, Lessor, and the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, Lessee, for Lot 6, Block 15 of Union Pacific Railroad 1st Addition to the Town of Medicine Bow, Wyoming. Said lease is for the purpose of a site for the Medicine Bow Senior Citizens' Center. The term of the lease shall be for five (5) years at a total annual rent of \$1. The Lessee shall have the option to renew this Lease for an additional five-year term.

CARBON COUNTY PLANNING & DEVELOPMENT

Public hearings were held before the Board on the following:

Case #81-21 - Zone Change - Rocky A Goodro, 1820 McTavish, Rawlins, Wy. 82301, zone change from RAM (Ranching, Agriculture, and Mining) to RD-1 (Residential Development) to allow for the construction of one single-family residence on a 1.3 acre parcel of land. Site is legally described as a tract in the NE 1/4, NE 1/4 Section 10, Township 17 North, Range 84 West, Carbon County, Wyoming. A motion was made by Lemich and seconded by McMahon to approve. Roll was called with the following results: Grieve-aye, Lemich-aye, and McMahon-aye.

JOHNSON ADDITION TO THE CITY OF RAWLINS-ANNEXATION PLAT


