EMERGENCY SERVICES AGENCY

A motion was made by Lemich, seconded by McMahon and unanimously carried to sign the Amendment as follows:

ADDENDUM

WHEREAS, the Carbon County Commissioners at their meeting of June 1, 1982, adopted and approved a resolution establishing in Carbon County, Wyoming, an Emergency Management Department; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Rawlins, Carbon County, Wyoming, has requested an Addendum thereto specifying the Management Council in more detail prior to its approval of the said Resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE PREMISES, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Section 1 of the Resolution passed by the Board of County Commissioners, Carbon County, Wyoming at its regular meeting of June 1, 1982, creating an Emergency Management Department is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

"Section 1. That there is hereby created the Carbon County/City Emergency Management Department, which shall be governed by a Council Consisting of:

- a. All three County Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming.
- b. Sheriff of Carbon County, Wyoming.
- c. Mayor of City of Rawlins, Wyoming.
- d. Three City Council members of the City of Rawlins to be selected by the Rawlins City Council.
- e. The City Manager for the City of Rawlins or his designee.

The Chairman of the County Commissioners shall be Chairman of the Council. The Vice-Chairman shall be elected by the Emergency Management Council."

The remaining portions of said Resolution shall remain in full force and effect as set forth in said Resolution.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS

AMENDMENT NO. 1 - The Adoption of this amendment will permit the legislature to authorize the investment of state funds in the capital stock of corporations or associations.

AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE 16, SECTION 6. LOAN OF CREDIT: DONATIONS PROHIBITED: WORKS OF INTERNAL IMPROVEMENT  
Neither the state nor any county, city, township, town, school district, or any other political subdivision, shall loan or give its credit or make donations to or in aid of any individual, association or corporation, except for necessary support of the poor. The state shall not engage in any work of internal improvement unless authorized by a two-thirds vote of the people.

AMENDMENT NO. 2 - The adoption of this amendment will permit an increase of the state levy for education by six (6) mills, a decrease of the county levy for education by six (6) mills and permit the legislature to authorize a special school district property tax levy and to allocate a portion of this levy in an equitable manner in response to the Wyoming Supreme Court decision of January, 1980, mandating equilization of school finance.

AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE 15, SECTION 15. STATE TAX FOR SUPPORT OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS

For the support of the public schools in the state there may be levied each year a state tax not exceeding twelve mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of the property in the state.

AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE 15, SECTION 17. COUNTY LEVY FOR SUPPORT AND MAINTENANCE OF PUBLIC SCHOOLS

There shall be levied each year in each county of the state a tax of not to exceed six (6) mills on the dollar of the assessed valuation of the property in each county for the support and maintenance of the public schools. This tax shall be collected by the county treasurer and disbursed among the school districts within the county as the legislature shall provide. The legislature may authorize board of trustees of school districts to levy a special tax on the property of the district. The legislature may also provide for the distribution among one or more school districts of not more than three-fourths of any revenue from the special school district property tax in excess of a state average yield, which shall be calculated each year, per average daily membership.

AMENDMENT No. 3 - The adoption of this amendment will permit the treasurer of the State of Wyoming to seek reelection in the same manner as other elected officials.

AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE 4, SECTION 11. STATE OFFICERS: ELECTION: QUALIFICATIONS: TERMS.

There shall be chosen by the qualified electors of the state at the times and places of choosing members of the legislature, a secretary of state, auditor, treasurer, and superintendent of public instruction, who shall have attained the age of twenty-five (25) years respectively, shall be citizens of the United States, and shall have the qualifications of state electors. They shall severally hold their offices at the seat of government for the term of four (4) years and until their successors are elected and duly qualified. The legislature may provide for such other state officers as are deemed necessary.
