HANNA FIRE DEPARTMENT

A motion was made by Lemich, seconded by Grieve and unanimously carried to allow \$1,000.00 towards the purchase of an air compressor for the Hanna-Carbon County Fire Department.

CARBON COUNTY AGRICULTURAL EXTENSION SERVICE

Mary Gruenewald, Carbon County Home Economist and Becky VonForell, Carbon County 4-H Agent, gave a report of the activities of the agents office. They presented a draft of an Educational Needs Assessment Survey which will provide the office with information in planning future educational programs.

SHIRLEY BASIN FIRE DEPARTMENT

Dallas C. Thompson and David Grouns, members of the Shirley Basin Fire Department and the County Volunteer Fire Department asked the Commissioners for help in upgrading their present equipment. The Commissioners took the request under advisement.

RYAN PARK SKI AREA

A delegation interested in developing a ski area at Ryan Park presented a proposal to the Commissioners identifying the possibility of the project.

The complex would cost approximately \$1,550,000.00. According to the group, the only feasible way to develop the area would be with public funds under recreational development.

The Commissioners made no commitment, but suggested that the School District also be contacted for input.

K.I.D.S. CRISIS CENTER

Members of the K.I.D.S. Crisis Center of Rawlins & Saratoga met with the Commissioners to discuss the need for space with regards to emergency shelter for youth who are abused, battered, run aways, or need help because of substance abuse. Shelters being used now are the jails or hospital. The Commissioners took the matter under advisement.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned until the following day.

FEBRUARY 2, 1983

The Board met at 10:00 A.M. Commissioners Robert Grieve and Emil Lemich were present. Martin McMahon was absent. Commissioner Grieve, Chairman.

CARBON COUNTY FAIRBOARD

A motion was made by Lemich, seconded by Grieve and unanimously carried to reappoint Russell Herring for a five year term beginning 2/1/83 and ending 2/1/88.

CARBON COUNTY FIRE DEPARTMENT

A motion was made by Lemich, seconded by Grieve and unanimously carried to call for bids on two Fire Department Tankers.

REPRESENTATION OF THE GAME AND FISH

Representatives of the Game and Fish Department and the County Attorney's Office requested the County Commissioners adopt a resolution relating to the threatening or killing of livestock and wildlife by dogs running at-large.

The proposed resolution would supplement the existing Wyoming Statute by making the running of dogs at-large a punishable crime, permit ranchers to shoot dogs that threaten or kill livestock and would permit any peace officer to shoot an animal that is threatening or has killed a big game animal.

Nick Deegan and Craig Williams, Deputy County Attorney's will draft a resolution concerning these ordinances and present the resolution to the Game and Fish Department and the Sheriff's Office for comments. The resolution will then be proposed to the County Commissioners.

CARBON COUNTY PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT

Public Hearing was held before the Board of Commissioners on the following:

Case No. 82-42 - Zone Change - Gary D. Buck, P. O. Box 694, Encampment, WY 82325, zone change from RAM (Ranching, Agriculture, Mining) to RD-10 (Residential Development) to allow for the development of one single-family residence on a 10 acre parcel of land east of Encampment. Site legally described as part of Lot 10, Section 5, Township 14 North, Range 83 West, Carbon County.

Case No. 82-43 - Zone Change - Richard N. Blake, P. O. Box 133, Encampment, WY 82325, zone change from RAM (Ranching, Agriculture, Mining) to RD-10 (Residential Development) to allow for the development of up to four single-family residences on a 40 acre parcel southeast of Riverside. Site legally described as SE $\frac{1}{4}$  NW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 5, Township 14 North, Range 83 West, Carbon County.

A motion was made by Lemich to table Case No. 82-42 and Case No. 82-43. The motion was seconded by Grieve. Roll was called with the following results: Lemich, Aye; Grieve, Aye.

A public hearing was held before the Board of County Commissioners February 2, 1983 at 3:00 P.M. to consider the petition of a Community Development Block Grant for funding the building of Senior Citizens Centers in Dixon and Saratoga. No public comments were entered.

A motion was made by Lemich, seconded by Grieve and unanimously carried to allow Lance Stewart to attend an Economic Development Course at the University of Arizona in Tucson, Arizona the week of February 7, 1983.

RESOLUTION 1983 ~ 1

WHEREAS, the citizens of Carbon County have shown a need and desire for Senior Citizens Centers in Dixon and Saratoga, Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, no appropriate facilities are available to meet the needs of the Senior Citizens and requirements of state and federal programs; and

WHEREAS, Carbon County has clearly demonstrated a commitment to Senior Citizens through the development of a comprehensive service delivery program throughout the county; and

WHEREAS, Carbon County must appropriate increasing amounts of funding to the Senior Citizens program in order to offset rising costs of operations and maintenance, as well as continued decreases in Federal Aging monies, jeopardizing the completion of the Senior Citizens Centers construction program;

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS of CARBON COUNTY, WYOMING, that the Board approves the submission of this grant application to the State of Wyoming and that the preparation of this application has been conducted in compliance with all appropriate citizens participation, federal and state requirements.

ARK INDUSTRIES

Frank Smith, Road Supervisor and Sam Verplanke, Maintenance Supervisor gave their monthly reports.

The following agreements were executed and placed on file:

LEASE AGREEMENT (GRAVEL)

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 1st day of February, 1983, by and between Carbon County, Wyoming, (lessee) acting by and through its Board of County Commissioners and Miller Estate Company (lessor) of Carbon County, State of Wyoming.

The lessor hereby warrants that he/she has the full legal authority to be signatory to this lease, and hereby grants the authority to Carbon County to remove aggregate from the following described land:

SE $\frac{1}{4}$  SW $\frac{1}{4}$  SECTION 7, T22N, R85W, OF THE 6TH P.M.

TOTAL ACRES = 24+

Carbon County hereby agrees to pay the sum of 30 cents per ton for all material removed. Payments to be made on a quarterly basis.

The above described land and use is leased from 1 January, 1983 until 1 January, 1988. Carbon County shall have the right to re-negotiate this lease 90 days prior to its expiration, if so desired.

Carbon County shall have the right to erect such temporary structures, set up equipment (crushers, hot plants, etc.) build roads, set cattleguards, install fences, gates and use such equipment as is necessary to perform the mining and production of aggregate, on the above described premises.

Carbon County agrees to provide the necessary insurance for the operation of an aggregate mining and production facility, and to hold the lessor Miller Estate Company harmless in any and all areas. Due to the use of the premises by Carbon County.

It is understood by both parties that this agreement is subject to all applicable rules and regulations established by County, State and Federal Agencies having jurisdiction over such.

AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT made as of the 2nd day of February, 1983, between the Owner, Carbon County Commissioners, Carbon County, State of Wyoming, and the Contractor, Rawlins Sand and Gravel Co., Inc., a Wyoming Corporation, P. O. Box 1360, Rawlins, Wyoming 82301.

The Contractor shall screen and stockpile approximately forty-five thousand (45,000) tons of 1½ inch minus material at a location designated by the Owner approximately one half mile north of the area off of the Platte River known as "Miracle Mile" area which is north of Seminoe Dam. Upon completion of the work, the Contractor shall grade the pit area so as not to leave any sharp or steep embankments. The Owner will be responsible for all permits, royalties and reclamation work.

Work will commence upon receipt of notification to proceed from the Owner and said work shall be completed within 60 days.

The Owner shall pay the Contractor in current funds for the performance of the work the sum of one and 30/100 dollars (\$1.30) per ton for the stockpiled materials. Quantities shall be determined by the Owner's acceptance of the measured piles of material produced and from a predetermined weight of material per cubic yard.

Progressive payments to be made as submitted by the aforementioned method of quantity determination with a retainage of five percent (5%) to be withheld and to be paid at the conclusion of the advertised period as per state statutes.


OIL SPRINGS ROAD
