A motion was made by Lemich, seconded by Grieve, and unanimously carried to accept the low bid of Luverne Fire Equipment Co., Douglas, Wyoming.

FIRE PROTECTION

A motion was made by Lemich, seconded by Grieve and unanimously carried to execute the following agreement for Fire Protection:

MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT FOR FIRE PROTECTION

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into on this 14th day of December, 1982, by and between the CITY OF RAWLINS, hereinafter referred to as the "City", the COUNTY OF CARBON, WYOMING, herein-after referred to as the "County", and the DEPARTMENT OF INTERIOR, BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT, herein-after referred to as the "BLM".

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WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the County provides for fire protection to the residents and businesses located within the County and outside of the municipalities or other towns within the County as authorized by Wyo. Stat. # 18-3-509 (1977); and

WHEREAS, the City provides fire protection services for its residents and businesses as authorized by Wyo. Stat. #15-1-103 (a) (xxi) (1977); and;

WHEREAS, the BLM, in cooperation with the County and City, attempts to provide limited fire protection services to the areas within the County under its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, it is the mutual desire of all parties to this Agreement to formulate a plan to come to the mutual aid of each other in the prevention of fire within Carbon County,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing and mutual covenants herein contained, the County, City and BLM agree as follows:

1. Declaration of Policies: Hereby declared to be the policy of the City, County, and BLM to achieve maximum fire protection for the residence and businesses within the county by undertaking a cooperative effort and providing mutual aid.

2. Definitions: For the purposes of this Agreement, the following definitions shall apply:

(a) Receiving Agency: The receiving agency shall be the agency who receives the initial report and request for assistance in fire prevention.

(b) Responsible Agency: The responsible agency shall be the agency having primary jurisdiction over the area in which the fire protection assistance has been requested.

(i) The City shall have primary jurisdiction over all those areas which are encompassed now or hereinafter within the corporate limits of the City of Rawlins, Carbon County, Wyoming as well as the Rawlins-Carbon County Airport.

(ii) The BLM shall have primary jurisdiction over all those lands which are considered by the BLM public lands and held under their jurisdiction, supervision and control.

(iii) The County shall have primary jurisdiction over all lands which do not fall under the primary jurisdiction of the City or BLM.

(c) Cooperating Agency: The cooperating agency shall mean any agency that has been requested to provide assistance or mutual aid in fire protection by a responsible agency.

3. Suppression: In the providing of fire protection hereunder, the parties agree that the following procedures shall be followed in providing mutual aid:

(a) Reporting: All calls or requests for fire protection shall be reported immediately by the receiving agency to the responsible agency. Upon such report all further actions and instruction shall be issued from the responsible agency.

(b) Initial Suppression: It shall be the responsibility of the responsible agency to undertake actions for initial suppression of any situation reported to the responsible party. A cooperating agency may undertake initial action upon request of a responsible party and on behalf of the responsible party. All such requests shall be made from and to the following individuals:

(i) City - Chief of the City of Rawlins Fire Department.

(ii) County - Fire Warden of Carbon County.

(iii) BLM - Fire Management Officer of Rawlins District, Carbon County, Wyoming.

4. Authority: The responsible agency shall hold primary responsibility for fire prevention and will be the command agency responsible for providing all decisions. In the event that the responsible party is not the party providing initial suppression, the cooperating agency providing such initial suppression shall make all command decisions until the arrival of the responsible agency.

5. Request for Mutual Aid: Requests for mutual aid by a cooperating agency shall be subject to the following terms and conditions:

(a) Eight Hour Limitation: A cooperating agency responding for fire prevention will provide mutual aid on a nonreimbursable basis for a period not to exceed eight hours. In the event that a cooperating agency provides assistance beyond the initial eight hours, the cooperating agency shall be reimbursed by the responsible agency at the rates provided in Schedule "A" which is attached to this Agreement.

(b) Limitation: In no event shall a cooperating agency be required to provide mutual aid when, in the decision of the cooperating agency, such aid endangers the cooperating agency's responsibility to provide primary fire protection within its primary jurisdiction.

(c) Request for Assistance: Any request for mutual aid from a responsible party to a cooperating agency shall include a verbal statement of the amount and type of equipment requested, the number of personnel requested, and shall specify the location to which the equipment and personnel are to be dispatched. It shall be the cooperating agency's sole responsibility and decision as to the type of equipment and number of personnel actually dispatched by the cooperating agency.

6. Limitations Upon Liability: Each of the parties shall hold the other respective parties harmless and indemnify such party against any and all liability, losses, costs, materials used, equipment, damages,

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suits, actions or claims of any person, firm, corporation or association other than each other which result from the operation or services provided under the terms of the Agreement, including all costs, damages, suits, actions or claims which result hereunder.

7. Miscellaneous: In no event shall "first line City equipment" respond outside of the corporate limits of the City of Rawlins other than the Municipal Airport.

In no event shall the BLM be responsible to provide mutual aid for "structure fires". It is the express intention of the parties to this Agreement that the only mutual aid provided by the BLM shall be such assistance as may be requested from time to time or responsibility of the BLM in the fire protection of grass and brush fires.

8. Term: This Agreement shall be effective from and after the date first above written and shall terminate upon the withdrawal of any party to this Agreement.
