CONSERVATION DISTRICTS

A motion was made by Lemich, seconded by York and unanimously carried to adopt the following resolution:

RESOLUTION 1984 - 6OF CARBON COUNTY, WYOMINGBOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners for Carbon County, Wyoming have received a request from the Little Snake River Conservation District, the Medicine Bow Conservation District and the Saratoga-Encampment-Rawlins Conservation District to change the election of the Board of Supervisors of each District from a special election to the General Election.

WHEREAS, it is deemed necessary and proper to change the election of said boards to the times of each general election.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Wyoming Election Code shall apply to all Conservation District elections in Carbon County and that all such elections shall be held at the General Election beginning with the 1984 General Election. The Little Snake River Conservation District shall include: Baggs, District 15, Precinct 1; Dixon, District 14, Precinct 2; and Savery, District 14, Precinct 1. The Medicine Bow Conservation District shall include: Leo, District 6, Precinct 1; Shirley Basin, District 6, Precinct 2; Medicine Bow, District 7, Precinct 1; Hanna-Elmo, District 8, Precinct 1; Elk Mountain, District 9, Precinct 1; and McFadden, District 10, Precinct 1. The Saratoga-Encampment-Rawlins Conservation District shall include: Lamont, District 4, Precinct 1; Seminoe Dam, District 5, Precinct 1; Sinclair, District 16, Precinct 1; Rawlins, District 1, Precincts 1 and 2, District 2, Precincts 1 and 2, District 3, Precincts 1, 2 and 3; Saratoga, District 11, Precincts 1 and 2; Bennett, District 13, Precinct 1; Encampment, District 12, Precinct 1; and Riverside, District 12, Precinct 2.

CARBON COUNTY AGENT

A motion was made by York, seconded by Lemich and unanimously carried to execute the following agreement:

A G R E E M E N T

THIS AGREEMENT, Made and entered into by and between the University of Wyoming, hereafter referred to as the University, and the Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, hereafter referred to as the County.

WITNESSETH: That Whereas, it is desired by the County to employ, under the Federal Smith Lever Act and the State Acceptance Act of 1915 and amendments thereto covering Extension Work in Agriculture and Home Economics, a general development of educational programs throughout Carbon County, and that said work shall be done and directed under the supervision of the Associate Director of the Agricultural Extension Service of the University of Wyoming;

NOW THEREFORE, For and in consideration of the covenants and agreements of each to the other running, and for other good and valuable consideration, as herein contained, the said parties agree as follows:

That each party to this agreement shall contribute annually to support the work, the cash sum, equipment and services indicated by the following schedule:

<u>COOPERATING PARTIES</u>	<u>CASH CONTRIBUTIONS FOR:</u>
University of Wyoming Agricultural Extension Service	\$15,648.00 Salary (Includes fringe benefits)
County of: Carbon	\$10,320.00 Salary plus support

The County agrees to make its contribution to the University. The University will in turn make total disbursement of salary to the University Extension Agent being employed in the county.

Final payment of the annual contribution from the County must be received by the University prior to June 30 of each year.

In order that the University may receive the total County contributions for each fiscal year before June 30 of such year, the County agrees to make payments to the University as follows:

Four equal quarterly payments by August 10, November 10, February 10, and May 10.

THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS AGREEMENT shall be and remain in force and effect from July 1, 1984 until June 30, 1985 unless terminated by mutual consent of the two parties involved.

In event this position becomes temporarily vacant the unused funds contributed by the County will be credited toward salary for a replacement; if the agreement is terminated the unused funds will be refunded to the County by the University.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, The Board of County Commissioners of Carbon County, has caused this agreement to be executed by its Chairman on this 15th day of May, 1984, and the University of Wyoming has caused the same to be executed by the President of the University of Wyoming on this _____ day of _____, 19____.


