U.S. BUREAU OF RECLAMATION

Lawrence L. Nelson, P.E. from the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation presented a North Platte River Hydroelectric Study to the Commissioners. The study is investigating increasing the generation capabilities of the Bureau of Reclamation's existing North Platte River Basin power system. The study is also exploring the potential development of a 500 M W pumped storage powerplant at Seminoe or Alcova Reservoirs.

CARBON COUNTY ROAD & BRIDGE

A motion was made by Grieve and seconded by York to purchase the State Highway Shop and property at Medicine Bow for \$35,800.00.

SARATOGA FIRE DEPARTMENT

A motion was made by York and seconded by Lemich and unanimously carried to allow \$7,000.00 for the purchase of a compressor, air purification package and high pressure air storage system. The system will be portable and can be used by the county fire departments and dive rescue units.

OPTIONAL ONE PERCENT SALES AND USE TAX

Resolution No. 1984-13

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING OPTIONAL ONE PERCENT
SALES AND USE TAX IN CARBON COUNTY, WYOMING

WHEREAS, pursuant to Wyoming Statutes Section 39-6-412, 1977, and Section 39-6-518, Wyoming Statutes, 1980, Carbon County, Wyoming, is authorized to impose additional Sales and Use Tax for the County under the procedures set forth therein; and

WHEREAS, the prerequisites to adoption of this Resolution have been fulfilled including approval by the Electors of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of Carbon County, Wyoming as follows:

1. There is hereby adopted in Carbon County, Wyoming, an Excise Tax upon every retail sale of tangible personal property, admissions and services made within the County at the rate of one percent in addition to the three percent tax imposed by the State.
2. There is hereby imposed an Excise Tax at the rate of one percent on the storage, use and consumption of tangible personal property in the County. This one percent shall be in addition to the three percent Use Tax imposed by the State of Wyoming.
3. For the purpose of the taxes created hereby, Carbon County hereby adopts the provisions of Article IV and Article V of Chapter 6 of Title 39 of the Wyoming Statutes, 1977 as they are amended from time to time insofar as they are relevant. Any amendments made to the said Articles not in conflict with Section 39-6-412 shall automatically become a part of this Sales Tax Resolution.
4. Carbon County shall contract with Wyoming State Tax Commission so that the said Commission will perform all functions incident to the administration of the Sales Tax Resolution.
5. The amounts subject to the tax created by this Resolution shall not include the amount of any sales or Use Tax imposed by the State of Wyoming.
6. Proceeds of the tax created hereby shall be distributed in accordance with Wyoming law.
