DATA PROCESSING

Representatives of WYCOMP, Inc., Floyd Field and Kim Tipton, along with County representatives Darrell Stubbs, Dick Engstrom and Marilyn Bradford, accompanied by Pat Noonan discussed updating computer programming currently used by the County. A consulting agreement between WYCOMP, Inc. and Carbon County Government was presented. The agreement was turned over to County civil attorney, Wade Waldrip for review before execution.

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SENIOR SERVICES

Cathy Matson, Blanche McNamara, Walter Rasmussen, Howard Smith and Pat Cronk, representing Carbon County Senior Services, Inc. presented their proposed budget for fiscal year 1990-1991. Support from Carbon County was requested in the amount of \$104,590.

A letter of support was given to Carbon County Senior Services, Inc. from the Board for a grant application.

SENIOR SERVICES BOARD

A motion was made by Graalman, seconded by Wille and carried to appoint Nancy Pennock to a three year term on the Senior Services Board beginning March 1, 1990 and ending March 4, 1993.

LIQUOR LICENSES

A motion was made by Wille, seconded by Graalman and carried to approve the transfer of County Retail Liquor License #1989-4 from Key Bank of Wyoming, Rawlins dba Lamont Village to Sunco dba Lamont.

A motion was made by Wille, seconded by Graalman and carried to approve the transfer of County Retail Malt Beverage Permit #1989-13 from Richard Schank dba Dick's Service to Lamont Inc.

CARBON COUNTY SUBSTANCE ABUSE TASK FORCE INC.

Shirley Martinez, Tom Fitzgerald, and Rhoda Mathiesen, representing Carbon County Substance Abuse Task Force Inc. presented a budget request of \$1,500 and free rent for office space in the Carbon Building. The request was taken under advisement.

W.I.C.

Terry Williams from the State Department of Health and Social Services, presented a budget request for fiscal year 1990-1991 and discussed the possibility of hiring a full time nutritionist.

PLAY AND LEARNING, SARATOGA

Terry Allen and Donna Erickson, representing the Saratoga Play and Learning preschool reported that Region VIII Child Development has cut support of the Play and Learning center as of April 10, 1990. They requested assistance in applying for County funding.

ROAD & BRIDGE

County Road & Bridge Supervisor, Don Neuman, reported on a personnel meeting held recently.

Neuman discussed the possibility of hiring P.M.P.C. Consulting Engineers. The Board took the request under advisement and Neuman will report back to the Commissioners with terms at a later date.

The purchase of tires in the amount of \$5,000 was approved by the Board.

A motion was made by Wille, seconded by Graalman and carried to come out of executive session. (4:10 p.m.)


PRIVATE ROAD HEARING
