K.I.D.S., INC.

Linda Smith and Everett Mann talked with the Commissioners about the K.I.D.S., INC. building grant, and the administration of that grant. They presented an agreement for Linda Smith through the City of Rawlins, to over see the construction and completion of records concerning the grant for Carbon County.

A motion was made by Graalman, seconded by Felming and unanimously carried to sign the agreement.

CITY OF RAWLINS

Linda Smith of the City of Rawlins government, requested the Commissioners approve a resolution supporting the City of Rawlins' application for abandoned mine grant funds, and authorizing the City of Rawlins to include a request on behalf of the County Museum and Old Penetentiary.

A RESOLUTION SUPPORTING THE CITY OF RAWLINS APPLICATION FOR ABANDONED MINE FUNDS GRANT, AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF RAWLINS TO INCLUDE A REQUEST ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY MUSEUM AND OLD STATE PENITENTIARY IN SAID APPLICATION.

WHEREAS, the County Museum is a county entity; and

WHEREAS, the old Joint Pen Powers Board is a joint powers board entered in to by the City of Rawlins and the County of Carbon, and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners desire to support said application; and

WHEREAS, it is the desire of the Board of County Commissioners to support community efforts in revitalization of its economy; and

WHEREAS, there are grant funds available through the State of Wyoming, Abandoned Mine Land Reclamation Program, which was established by the Surface Mining Control and Reclamation Act of 1977, and the City of Rawlins desires to include an application on behalf of the Old Pen Joint Powers Board in the sum of \$2,825,570 for improvement of safety, health and security at the site, enhancement of the site as a historic site; and to enhance the economy of the Carbon County, and an application on behalf of the County Museum to relocate and enlarge the space for the County Museum in the amount of \$1,000,000; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners wishes to join in said application to support the Old Pen Joint Powers Board and the County Museum;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Board of County Commissioners of the County of Carbon, State of Wyoming, authorize the City of Rawlins to include in its grant application to the State of Wyoming Abandoned Mine Fund Grant Program, applications on behalf of the Carbon County Museum Board; the Board of County Commissioners further concur with the application on behalf of the Old Pen Joint Powers Board.
