A regular meeting of the Board of Carbon County Commissioners (BOCC) commenced Tuesday, March 4, 2025, at 9:00 a.m. at the Carbon Building-Courthouse Annex, Rawlins, WY. Attending the meeting were Chairman, R. Travis Moore, Vice Chairman Gwynn Bartlett, Commissioners John Johnson and Sue Jones. John Espy was absent

Chairman Moore called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

ADDITIONS / CORRECTIONS

Commissioner Johnson moved to approve the agenda as presented. Commissioner Bartlett seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

VOUCHERS

Commissioner Bartlett moved to approve payment to Sunrise Sanitation for \$75.00. Commissioner Johnson seconded and the motion passed with all voting for the motion except Commissioner Jones who abstained due to personal conflicts.

Commissioner Bartlett moved to approve the report of expenditures in the amount of \$139,330.22 for an aggregate total today of \$139,405.22. Commissioner Johnson seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

CONSENT AGENDA

Commissioner Johnson moved to approve the consent agenda noting any item could be removed for separate action. Clerk Smith noted the consent agenda includes February 18, 2025, regular meeting minutes; monthly receipts from the Planning and Development in the amount of \$325.00; a bond for Gina Helmetag, Assistant Treasurer for Town of Sinclair in the amount of \$50,000.00. Commissioner Jones seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

TOWN OF SINCLAIR RECREATION CENTER – Monte Thayer

Monte Thayer with the Town of Sinclair Recreation Center introduced senior citizens from the Town of Sinclair who wished to learn about County Government processes.

UW EXTENSION OFFICE

Emily Haver, UW Extension Educator, 4-H Youth Development, and County Coordinator and Matt Huey, Associate Director, provided a yearly update and an update on available positions. He discussed that Abby will now be in a new position as Small Acres Specialist and asked and received approval that she continues to utilize the current office space. The county ag agent will be backfilled in the future. Emily asked for clarification regarding department head meetings and Extensions participation and the desire of the Commissioners for regular updates.

ELECTED OFFICIALS & DEPARTMENT HEADS

Sheriff

Alex Bakken, Carbon County Sheriff presented a Memorandum of Agreement for board approval and Chairman's signature.

Commissioner Bartlett moved to approve the 287(g) Memorandum of Agreement with Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) for the purpose of collaborating public safety by facilitating the custodial transfer of specific aliens in LEA jail/correctional facilities to ICE for removal purposes at the time of the alien's scheduled release from criminal custody which will remain in effect until either party, upon 90-day written notice to the other party, provides notice of termination or suspension of the MOA. Commissioner Johnson seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

He discussed a quote he provided to Saratoga for a combined dispatch.

Attorney

Sarah Chavez Harkins requested and received approval to fill an upcoming vacant legal assistant position. She detailed that Judicial Dialog still isn't currently operational, so this position is very much needed. Matt stated the issue with Judicial Dialog should be resolved and access should be available now.

WY250 COUNTY COMMITTEE

WY250 County Committee President Candy Moulton provided an update on the status of the WY250 committee. Ms. Moulton detailed that they adopted a strategic plan, submitted the Grants to County application. They should receive notice of the grant award mid-April. She detailed the other grant opportunities that other organizations such as museums can apply for with the committee's review/approval prior to submission. Ms. Moulton detailed the goals, budget, and timing of the project.

Library

Maria Wentzel, Library Director, stated she would work with the WY250 Committee for future grant opportunities.

Commissioner Jones stated that some of the outlying libraries have contacted her about being open additional hours and the importance the libraries are to their communities. Ms. Wentzel stated that utilities vary from library to library. She stated they are open to help from municipalities to fund these services. Commissioner Jones stated that it's important for the public to understand that the library board does not fund maintenance and utilities to these outlying library buildings. The county and municipalities are covering the overhead of these locations. Commissioner Bartlett asked if she's looked at combining services with senior centers. She said they have been looking into this at Medicine Bow and appreciates the support they receive from the county and municipalities. Square footage is an issue with some locations to accommodate combined services.

Buildings & Grounds

Jeff Askins, Buildings and Grounds Manager, recognized his employee for his years of service and provided an update on the department's two new hires. He requested and received approval to go out for bids for custodial services for the Carbon Building and Jail and leave the current services at the Courthouse. He would like to bid the buildings individually and allow companies or individuals to bid for one, or both buildings. The BOCC authorized Mr. Askins to proceed with the bid process.

Road & Bridge

Kandis Fritz, Road & Bridge Coordinator presented bids received for 1992 Ford F250 Pickup, 1978 Belshie Trailer and 1974 Belshie Flatbed Trailer.

Bids were received for the 1992 Ford F250 Pickup from Ty Espy in the amount of \$565.77, Marvin Kirk Pantle in the amount of \$200.00, Aaron Miller in the amount of \$100.00, Steve Hays in the amount of \$901.00 and Alex Bakken in the amount of \$575.00. Bids for the 1978 Belshie Trailer were received from Kevin Pantle in the amount of \$1,151.00, Steve Hays in the amount of \$989.00 and Scott Thayer in the amount of \$1,682.00. Bids for the 1974 Belshie Flatbed Trailers were received from Marvin Kirk Pantle in the amount of \$100.00, Steve Hays in the amount of \$976.00 and Scott Thayer in the amount of \$351.00.

Commissioner Bartlett moved to award the bid for the 1992 Ford F250 Pickup (VIN# 2FTHF26G6PCA14442) to Steve Hays in the amount of \$901.00; the bid for the 1978 Belshie Trailer (VIN: 7418) to Scott Thayer in the amount of \$1,682.00; and the bid for the 1974 Belshie Flatbed Trailer (VIN: 3852) to Steve Hays in the amount of \$976.00. Commissioner Jones seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Fritz stated that payment still has not been received for the previous bid awarded on January 21, 2025, for the 1982 Western Star semi (VIN: 2WKPDCJE3CK908753) and the 1980 Birmingham lowboy trailer (VIN: VB198). The BOCC requested that she put these items back out for bid without a minimum bid being set.

Ms. Fritz provided an update on the CR1 Bridge. Concrete was poured last Friday and it will be about one more week until she can open the road to public.

Ms. Fritz stated that she has a meeting with Merchant McIntyre on Friday about more grant funding opportunities. She asked the BOCC if they would like her to continue to apply for various grants or wait until they know what the next fiscal year's budget looks like. Her biggest concern at this time is the condition of bridges. Commissioner Johnson asked how far two million goes on a project like county road 351? Commissioner Bartlett suggested to still meet with Merchant McIntyre to hear what's available before deciding on whether to apply or not. Commissioner Bartlett stated the time may be better spent speaking with the Bureau of Reclamation.

Ms. Fritz stated that it is that time of year again where she asks to go out for bid on Mag Chloride. She asked with the uncertainty of our budget, would the BOCC like for her to hold off on going out for bid. The board asked her to proceed with an informal bid knowing that the miles or amount applied could be reduced due to the budget.

Planning & Development

Kristy Rowan, Planning & Development Coordinator and Zoning Administrator presented a Certification of Recommended Action for C.U. Case File No. 2025-01 – SAC Wireless, Union Telephone Company and Saratoga Land and Cattle Company and requested to set a public hearing.

Commissioner Bartlett moved to accept the Certification of Recommended Action from the Carbon County Planning & Zoning Commission for C.U. Case File No. 2025-01 – SAC Wireless, Union Telephone Company and Saratoga Land and Cattle Company and schedule a public hearing for Tuesday, April 1, 2025, at 11:30 a.m. at the County Courthouse in Rawlins, Wyoming. Commissioner Johnson seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Clerk

Lisa Smith, County Clerk, presented a board application that was received for appointment to the Senior Services Board.

Commissioner Jones moved to appoint Daniel P. Lukowiak to the Carbon County Senior Services Board for the Hanna area and for a 3-year term ending March 2028. Commissioner Johnson seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Clerk Smith presented a service agreement for board approval and Chairman's signature.

Commissioner Jones moved to approve any commissioners' signature on the Merchant McIntyre Service Agreement in the amount of \$8,000.00 per month and for a term of March 1, 2025, through February 28, 2026, for government relations services with the addition of a 30 or 60 day termination clause. Commissioner Bartlett seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioners

Attorney Davis discussed scoping comments to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) regarding the Seminoe Pumped Storage Project Document #2. Attorney Davis says she

has a draft letter awaiting review of Tristen Rice. The deadline is prior to the next meeting and she requested approval upon legal review of the final version.

Commissioner Johnson moved to approve the final scoping comments to the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) regarding the Seminoe Pumped Storage Project Document #2 after legal review. Commissioner Bartlett seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

CITIZEN & COMMISSIONER DISCUSSION

Commission Johnson stated he attended a meeting with Q Creek regarding the proposed land swap. He said they did a good job addressing all public concerns.

Chairman Moore reminded the public that Hazardous Mitigation Plan is still out for public comment and encouraged everyone to be informed.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Commissioner Bartlett moved to go into executive session at 11:04 a.m. with Clerk Smith and Ashley Mayfield Davis to discuss personnel, potential litigation and other matters considered confidential by law. Commissioner Jones seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Johnson moved to come out of executive session at 11:29 a.m., noting no action was taken and that the minutes be signed and sealed. Commissioner Bartlett seconded and the motion passed unanimously.

The RD Zone is intended to provide land for residential development that is typically single family detached and located within Town Expansion Areas and within or nearby Rural Centers. Residential single-family zones are intended to be located in areas planned for residential development that are easily accessible and infrastructure already exists or is readily available. Kristy Rowan, Planning & Development Coordinator and Zoning Administrator presented the case file.

Chairman Moore called for comments for or against the case. There being no comments, Chairman Moore closed the hearing at 11:36 a.m.

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 2015, as amended, and Wyo. Stat. Ann. §18-5-202(b), the Carbon County Planning and Zoning Commission held a public hearing on Monday, February 3, 2025, which hearing was advertised by public notice at least thirty (30) days prior to said hearing; and

WHEREAS, at the Monday, February 3, 2025, public hearing, the Carbon County Planning and Zoning Commission provided the public the opportunity to comment and the Carbon County Planning and Zoning Commission considered any public comments which were made at said public hearing; and

WHEREAS, at the conclusion of said Monday, February 3, 2025, public hearing, the Carbon County Planning and Zoning Commission voted to certify in writing its recommendation to the Carbon County Board of County Commissioners to adopt the zone change as an amendment to the Carbon County Official Zoning Map for Carbon County, Wyoming; and

WHEREAS, the Carbon County Board of County Commissioners, pursuant to the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 2015, as amended, and Wyo. Stat. Ann. §18-5-202(c) and after receipt of said certified recommendation of this zoning amendment to the Carbon County Official Zoning Map, advertised by public notice at least 14 days prior to a public hearing to take public input and comments on the proposed amendment, which said hearing occurred on Tuesday, March 4, 2025; and

WHEREAS, at said public hearing on March 4, 2025, the Carbon County Board of County Commissioners provided the opportunity for the public to comment and for the Carbon County Board of County Commissioners to consider any comments which were made on the proposed amendment; and

WHEREAS, the Carbon County Board of County Commissioners in considering the proposed amendment have also reviewed and considered the Carbon County Comprehensive Land Use Plan, as amended; and the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 2015, as amended; and

WHEREAS, the Carbon County Board of County Commissioners have determined that the proposed amendment is in general conformance with the Carbon County Comprehensive Land Use Plan, as amended, and that the proposed zone change meets the following applicable criteria of the Carbon County Zoning Resolution of 2015, as amended; and

WHEREAS, at a regularly scheduled meeting of the Carbon County Board of County Commissioners, by majority vote, the Carbon County Board of County Commissioners moved to approve the proposed zoning amendment to the Carbon County Official Zoning Map.
